CAO Report to Council September 18, 2018

Occupational Health and Safety: Administration has developed work procedures and reporting systems to satisfy compliance orders issued on July 31, 2018 by Mr. Mike Ireland -OH and S Officer Alberta Labour. This consisted of risk assessment and control documentation and other safe practices policies implemented for the Village of Donalda. Future updates will be required to remain compliant with Alberta Labour Regulations and Standards.

<u>Cannabis Legislation:</u> Administration has contracted GRA-Core Consulting to prepare amendments to Land Use Bylaw #625 for cannabis legislation. First reading was brought to Council on August 21, 2018, with a public hearing scheduled for September 18, 2018.

<u>Village of Donalda Office Building Evaluation:</u> Administration has received grant funding for a building envelope evaluation, I will be contacting David Murray Architect (same as Donalda Creamery) to conduct an inspection/report.

<u>Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP):</u> Administration has met with Stettler County Planning and Chief Administrative Officer on August 17, 2018 to discuss the draft plan. Council will receive draft plan for review prior to public hearing for the IDP.

<u>Animal Bylaw Enforcement:</u> Administration has contacted Old McDonalds Kennels regarding animal bylaw enforcement.

<u>Public Tax Auction for 2018</u>: Public Tax Auction is not required as all properties that were eligible for tax auction have been brought to current status on taxes owing.

<u>Assessment Complaints for 2018:</u> The Village of Donalda has received two (2) assessment complaints. One is Non-Residential and one is Residential.
