The bad news is that winter is pretty much here. Along with that comes icy streets and walkways. This means we all must adjust our driving and walking habits with much more caution. Hopefully everyone stays safe. The good news is that Christmas is almost here. In Donalda the Christmas Season really begins with the Village Christmas which will be held on Sunday **December 2** throughout downtown Donalda. One of the major highlights of this event is the Christmas Shopping for the Children which is held at the Drop-Inn Centre. Here the Children are able to shop for gifts for their family members. Each gift costs \$ 1.00. Volunteers are present to help them shop and gift wrap their gifts. They then take the wrapped gifts home and anxiously await Christmas. This event has now been held for a number of years. It has been interesting to watch young children learn about, and experience, giving rather than just receiving at Christmas time. After all this is the real meaning of our Christian Tradition that we call Christmas.

There has recently been concern expressed about mis-treatment of cats in our community. Cats do have the ability to multiply very quickly and if no one takes responsibility the community can very quickly become over-run. We in Donalda are very fortunate to have a volunteer group, The Donalda Animal Rescue Society, who work diligently with this problem. In recent years they have raised thousands of dollars through their own efforts. This money has been used almost entirely to offer spay and neutering procedures to both owned cats and to feral cats, as well as funding a re-homing program for many of these animals. Donalda is almost surrounded by agricultural crop land. These fields are home to many rodents. At this time of year with winter setting in these rodents tend to come into the Village for better protection. Our only practical defense against this invasion is to have a reasonable population of cats. In recent times mice have not been much of a problem in our Village and hopefully it remains that way. Going forward please continue to give support and appreciation to our Animal Rescue Group for the work they are accomplishing. Furthermore let's realize that our furry felines are an asset to our community and protect them by giving them their space. As we approach the Christmas Season the Village Council, Administration, and Staff wish everyone a safe and happy holiday.


