- This by-law shall be cited as the "Bylaw Enforcement Officer By-law."
- . In this bylaw the following words have the following meanings:
- a) "Bylaws" means the by-laws of the Municipality:
- "Bylaw Enforcement Officer" means a person or agency appointed as such by the Village
- <u>c</u> "Chief Administrative Officer" means the person appointed pursuant to By-law #679
- d) "Council" means the Council of the Village of Donalda;
- <u>e</u> "Municipal Government Act" means Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, Ch. M-26 as amended time to time;
- f) "Municipality" means the Village of Donalda;
- \dot{m} Enforcement Officer; The Municipal Council of the Village of Donalda is hereby authorized to appoint a Bylaw
- 4. The powers and duties of the Bylaw Enforcement Officer are as follows:
- a) To ensure that the bylaws of the Municipality are enforced;
- the directions of the Chief Administrative Officer; To report to the Council and Chief Administrative Officer or his/her designate and carry out
- c) To respond to and investigate complaints;
- d) To issue warnings, tickets or tags for violations;
- <u>e</u> To assist in the prosecution of by-law contraventions including gathering of evidence, the attendance of witnesses and any appearances in court that may be required;

- 7. carrying out his/her duties; Where it is alleged that a Bylaw Enforcement Officer, in carrying out his/her duties as a peace Bylaw Enforcement Officer has committed a disciplinary default, as defined by this by-law, while officer has committed a breach of duties, the committee shall hold a hearing to determine if the
- ∞ Officer has committed a disciplinary breach, the following procedures shall be followed: Where the Committee intends to carry out a hearing to determine whether a Bylaw Enforcement
- Adequate notice (a minimum of 2 days) in writing shall be given to the Bylaw Enforcement Committee considers to be affected by the alleged disciplinary breach; Officer who is alleged to have committed a disciplinary breach and to such other parties the
- 9 At the hearing the Committee shall give the By-law Enforcement Officer a reasonable opportunity of furnishing relevant evidence;
- C adequate opportunity of making representations by way of argument to the Committee; The Committee shall give the By-law Enforcement Officer or his/her representative an
- 9. Committee may, by a decision in writing with reasons, do the following: At the conclusion of a hearing to determine whether there has been a disciplinary breach, the
- i) Reprimand in writing the By-law Enforcement Officer, or
- Municipality, but such a period shall not exceed six (6) months; or ii) Suspend the By-law Enforcement Officer from acting as By-law Enforcement Officer for the
- iii) Terminate the appointment of the By-law Enforcement Officer.
- 10. For purposes of this By-law, the following shall be disciplinary defaults:
- Discreditable conduct where the By-law Enforcement Officer:
- likely to bring discredit upon the reputation of Bylaw Enforcement Officers; i) acts in a disorderly or inappropriate manner, or in a manner prejudicial to discipline or
- summary conviction under the Criminal Code of Canada ii) is guilty of an indictable offence under a federal statute or an offence punishable upon
- Insubordination, where the Bylaw Enforcement Officer by word or action and without iii)abets, connives or is knowingly an accessory to a general default described in this by-law
- 2 lawful excuse, disobeys omits or neglects to carry out any lawful order
- ယ **Deceit** – where the Bylaw Officer:
- i) knowingly makes or signs false statements in an official document or book
- alters or erases therein ii) without lawful excuse destroys, mutilates or conceals an official document or record or
- 4 Breach of Confidence - where the Bylaw Officer:
- i) divulges any matter which is it his/her duty to keep secret
- any person or investigation media or to any unauthorized person any law enforcement matter which could be injurious to ii) without proper authorization from the Municipal Council, communicates to the news
- S Corrupt Practice - where the Bylaw Officer:
- official capacity i) fails to account for or make a prompt, true return of money or property received in an
- testimonial without the consent of the Committee ii) directly or indirectly solicits or receives a gratuity, present, pass, subscription or

- 13. The Bylaw Enforcement Appeal Board has the power to change, confirm or remove any hearing procedures the disciplinary action was taken; disciplinary action brought forward by the Bylaw Enforcement Committee under the same
