

Residents are still able to engage with the Council via the delegation process. To become a delegate, residents must submit a delegation form (available at the Village Office, or on the Village Website) by 10 a.m. on the Tuesday prior to the next council meeting. Due to time constraints, only two delegations may be heard at each meeting per section 6 of Bylaw 765-23 and the Village's Delegation Policy. The delegation process also allows administration and council time to adequately prepare the necessary information required to address the delegation.

Village of Donalda Land Use Bylaw Renewal



WHAT IS A LAND USE BYLAW?

A Land Use Bylaw (LUB) outlines the rules and regulations for development of land in Donalda for each district (zone)
as well as the process of making decisions for development permit applications. A Land Use Bylaw is required for
every municipality in Alberta as per the requirements in the Municipal Government Act. This includes the division of
the municipality into land use districts (zones).

WHY IS THE LUB BEING AMENDED?

- The amendment will ensure the Land Use Bylaw is consistent with the current legislative requirements of the Municipal Government Act.
- Updated regulations will be introduced for the use and development of land and buildings that support the overall aims and desires of the community.
- The LUB will be made easier to interpret by the general public and administration.

WHAT IS BEING AMENDED?

- Zoning: The bylaw renewal will update the zoning to match the appropriate use of land alongside new and updated mapping viewable to the public.
- General Regulations policies such as recreational vehicles, outdoor storage, and fabric covered structures are being proposed.
- Specific Use Regulations will see new policies such as short-term rental accommodations, solar energy collectors, wind turbines, and modular homes.
- Clearer wording around parking regulations.

WHEN IS THE OPEN HOUSE?

• The Open House will be taking place on November 15, 2023, from 5-7 PM. The location for the Open House will be at the Donalda Community Hall (5103 Main Street).

WHY SHOULD YOU ATTEND?

• You will learn more about the policies that are being implemented and have a chance to voice any considerations.

VILLAGE OF DONALDA FRANCHISE FEE INCREASE NOTICE

Please be advised the Village of Donalda is proposing to increase the local franchise fee, which is charged to Apex Utilities Inc. effective January 15, 2024, as per Council Resolution 248-23. The Village of Donalda can revise the franchise fee on an annual basis pursuant to Clause 5(b) of the Standard Natural Gas Distribution System Franchise Agreement as per Alberta Utilities Commission Decision 24796-D01-2019. The fee is recovered by Apex Utilities Inc. from its customers that receive natural gas service in the Village of Donalda.

The franchise fee will be increased from 17% to 17.5% on the delivery charge of Apex Utilities Inc. The average residential increase has been estimated at \$0.43 per month.



Ranch Rodeo


Due to a lack of team entries, our ranch rodeo
